On the occasion of the World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development a high level event on Culture and Sustainable Development, 21 May 2019 was held

The Broadcasting Commission of Jamaica has received TWO Gold Muse awards in the International Muse Creative Awards Competition for 2018. The BCJ advertisements that received awards were the very popular "Pinchy Dead" video, and the BCJ's most recent release -"Ordinary People", which warns parents to be more aware of what their children are viewing online. and encourages online users to be more careful

Pinchy Dead" warns against fake news, when consuming and sharing content online. The video has received rave reviews from critics, newscasts and the wider public. It was viewed on social media over 2 million times and shared over 8,000 times within the first month of release

The Current Status of Ocean Science around the World



The world ocean is one, interconnected and vast. It covers 70% of the surface and contains more than 95% of the water of the planet. Grasping such vastness is challenging. Yet we have to realize that the ocean's resistance and resilience are not infinite. We can and should no longer assume that the world ocean can continue absorbing the effects of unsustainable human activities endlessly and still continue providing its vital services. The ocean is vulnerable. It is our duty to use it sustainably. This is our responsibility to both current and future generations. We must act now to ensure the sustainability of the world ocean.

There is a sense of urgency and responsibility - indeed, a moral imperative - to ensure intergenerational equity in our interaction with the global commons, of which the world ocean is one. We urge the integration of ocean matters, including the social and economic dimensions of how people use and migrate through the world's ocean. Understanding the ocean as a system requires untangling its complexity through research and sustained observations, supported by adequate infrastructures and investments. In short, our understanding of the ocean and its contribution to sustainability largely depends on our capacity to conduct effective ocean science.

#### REGIONAL NEWS

The University of the West Indies Open Campus on St. Kitts hosted a three day workshop "Training Media Workers in the Effective and Proper Use of Social Media' 14 -16 May 2019

The purpose of the workshop was to introduce media workers in St. Kitts and Nevis to the effective and proper use of social media and the platforms that exist.

SG Antonio Maynard said that they must continuously adapt experiment and anticipate what's coming next to be able to produce impactful broadcasting. To strengthen his point, he noted that during the passage of Hurricane Irma a radio broadcaster was forced to take the initiative in utilizing the mobile phone to continue broadcasting reports of the hurricane after the broadcasting station was struck by the storm and was unable to operate as normal.

They were assisted by two very experienced Caribbean media professionals— Wesley Gibbings from Trinidad and Tobago who is the founding President of the Association of Caribbean Media Workers and Anika Kentish from Antigua and Barbuda.

The workshop is being carried out by the UNESCO Cluster Office for the Caribbean with the financial assistance of the International Programme for the Development of Communication.

Secretary General of the St. Kitts-Nevis National Commission for UNESCO, Antonio Maynard, retired after 15 years of service on May 31, 2019.

As a result of his active support, and advocacy, St. Kitts and Nevis was instrumental in creating, and chairing, the first ever Small Island Developing States (SIDS) Committee of Representatives at UNESCO in Paris, from 2006, to facilitate a dedicated dialogue between Caribbean, Indian Ocean and Pacific SIDS delegates and the UNESCO SIDS Secretariat.

120 delegates from over 85 countries attended the Third International Youth Forum (IYF3) on Creativity and Heritage along the Silk Road, in UNESCO designated creative cities of Changsha and Nanling, China.

Twelve delegates from the Caribbean; Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago, Barbados, the Bahamas, St Kitts & Nevis, the Dominican Republic and Cuba. The Caribbean contingent joined the Caribbean Embassies in Beijing (namely the Embassies of Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica, Barbados, and the Bahamas) in presenting the inaugural Caribbean Film Festival in Changsha; a five-day festival featuring films from Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago screened at universities across Changsha, China.

The event was organised by UNESCO, the China National Commission for UNESCO, the World Federation of UNESCO Clubs, Centers and Associations and the Chinese Municipal Governments in Changsha and Nanjing March 31 - April 3.
